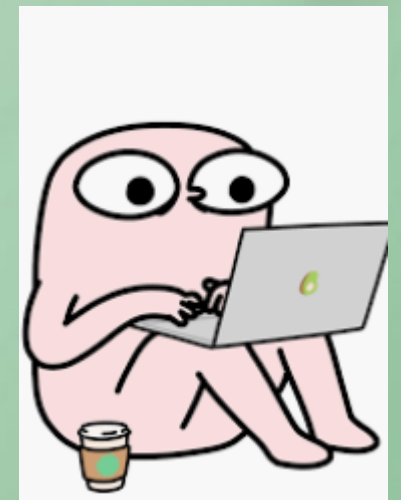
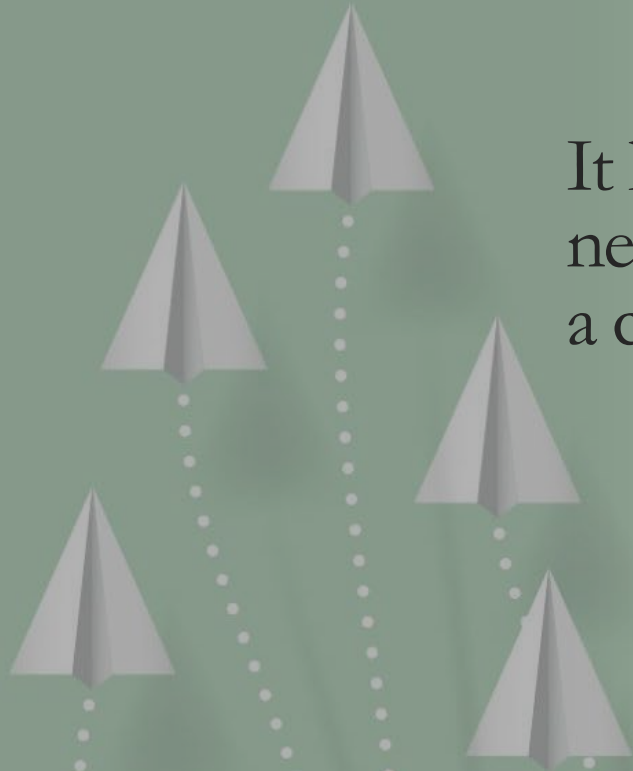


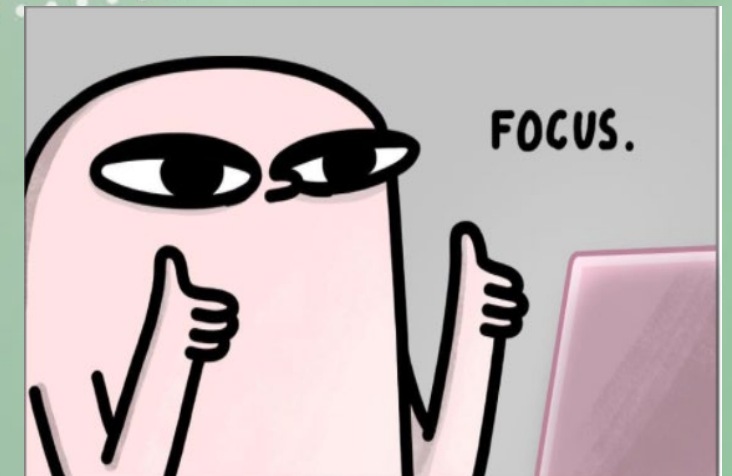
Hey guys whilst you have all this time on your hands please have a look at this quick power point.

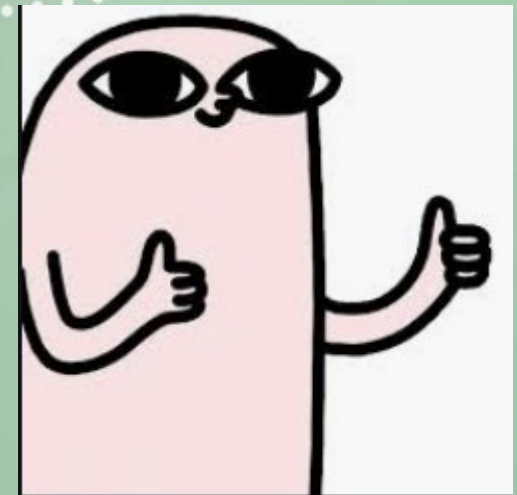
