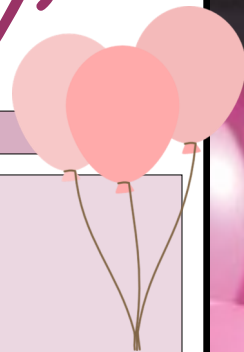




Miss Coombes says 'hello!'

3rd Birthday cake, she has asked for a 'Frozen' theme. Watch this space for a picture!

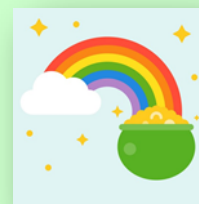


Last week I made pasties for tea! Yummy!



A rainbow

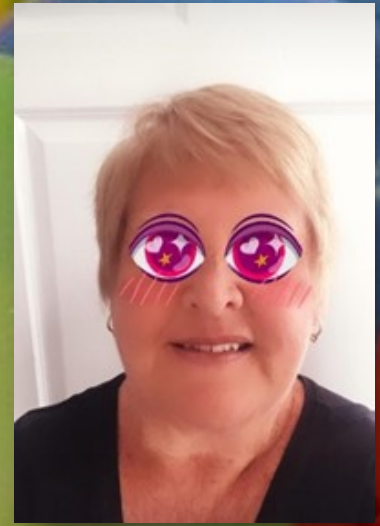

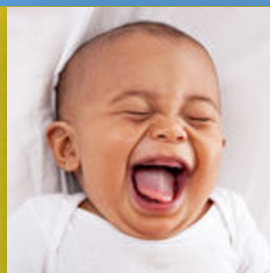
