Dear Parents and Carers

As we are approaching the end of this academic year, I am writing to you with some end of term updates. We are equally as proud of all the students who have engaged so positively with their online distance learning and face to face sessions with their teachers. Children, from 7 - 11, have engaged in Classcharts tasks; recorded lessons; live lessons; challenges on social media; on-site lessons; induction lessons and projects. The quality of work produced by some students has been superb and we are celebrating success with awards for KS3 and KS4 achievement and attitude to learning. The aim is that all students have caught up on any missed Distance Learning work by Christmas. Together, we'll make sure that no child is left behind.

## A message from Lisa Verity, Chair of our Local Governing Body:


