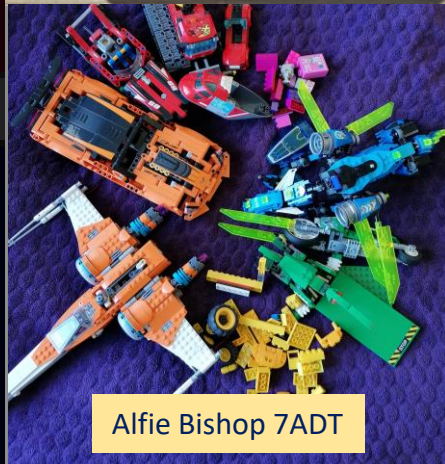

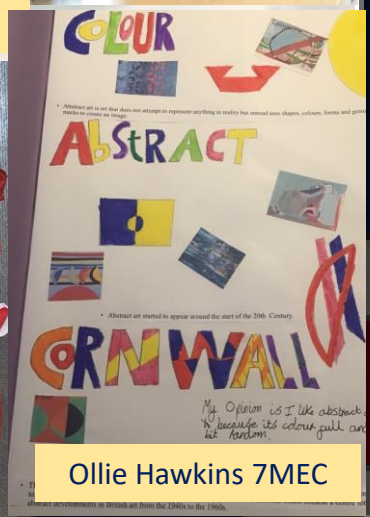

 someone else's cause

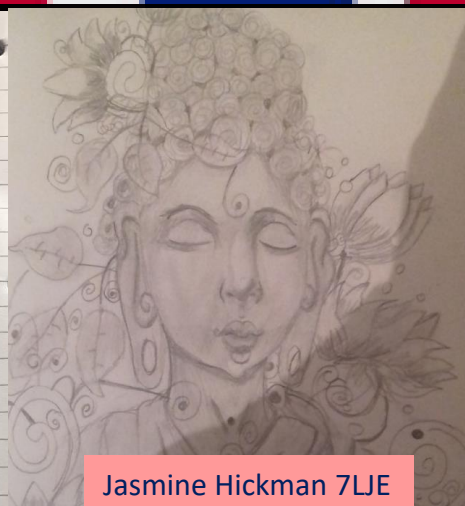
Dickens presents PIP's change in characterisation as for

### Snakes and ladders

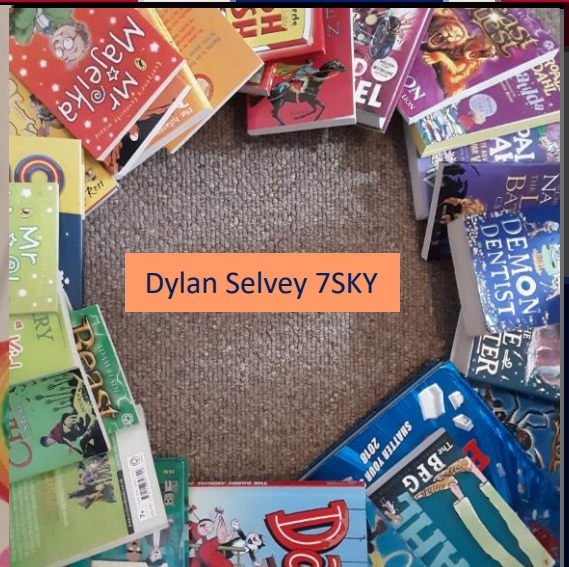

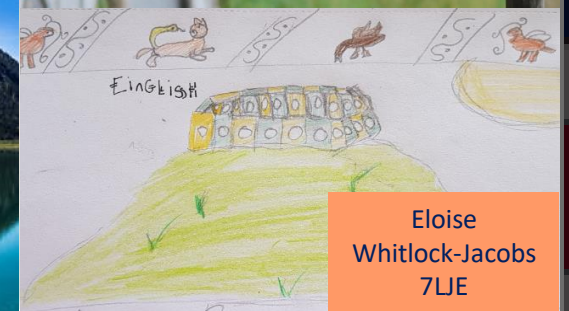
## Self Esteem tips

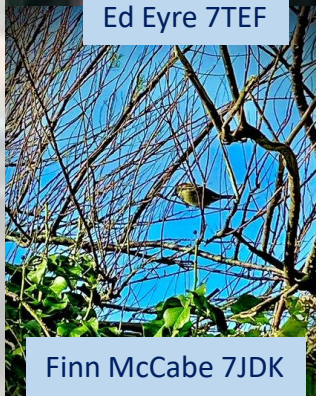

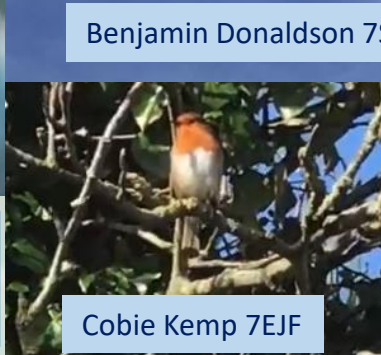
