Dear Parents and Carers,

Once again, Year 11 have made us very proud as they complete their second set of English, Maths and Science PPEs. This is not only great practise for the summer examinations but will also help teachers plan and really focus on any areas where students may need additional support and intervention.

With their GCSEs only 6 teaching weeks away, we thought it timely to update you on some frequently asked questions:

What happens if my child tests positive / does not sit an exam?

TAGs (Teacher Assessed Grades) no longer exist under any circumstance.

In line with previous years, the only way your child will be awarded a GCSE is if they sit the exams. All subjects have more than one exam paper or assessment point. In extreme circumstances (and coupled with medical evidence, for example a COVID-19 positive test result), it may be that the examination board will look at the marks from the first exam paper completed and award a grade from that evidence. Exam papers are deliberately timetabled more than 10 days apart to make this a possibility.

Should your child test positive, or have any other issues, during this time, please ring the school immediately, and Mrs Higginson, Examinations Officer, will communicate with you accordingly. As a reminder, whilst the last exam is 23rd June, the **contingency exam period is up until 29th June**. This is the time exam boards have put aside in case there is any disruption during the exam period - please do not book holidays until after this date.

How should my child be using these crucial last months?

On average, the advice is that Year 11 spend a few hours after school each day, and between 4 – 6 hours a day over the weekend / holiday period, revising.

They have a huge amount of support to help with this:

- Real clarity from teachers who are setting revision tasks and practice questions as homework see Class Charts
- SORT activities every Friday in tutor time to support students in how to revise
- Staffed, quiet study spaces after school every Monday Thursday, 3-4pm
- A range of intervention in the mornings and afterschool (as an example: English Tuesday and Friday 3–4pm; Maths Wednesday 3-4pm and Science Thursday 3-4pm)
- Parent and student SORT workshops
- A dedicated web page to revision resources: https://tretherras.net/sort-revision/

Do they get study leave?

We have worked hard on a 'Year 11 Leavers' Plan' to get the balance right between recognising the disruption they have faced and understanding that some students need the time and space to revise from home.

Students will be in school until May half term. After half term, there will be opportunities for your child to leave site, provided they are not in an exam, nor in an Exam Masterclass. If they do not want to leave site, independent study areas will be provided.

Masterclasses are subject specific revision sessions, run by specialists, right before the exam. Having this input immediately before their exam can really help students hone their skills and remind them of all those top tips! They are compulsory sessions that could really make a difference.

Students will receive a timetable with all the details on before Easter, so they can be best prepared for their final weeks. This timetable does not replace their official exam timetable which should be looked at carefully, checked, and followed every day.



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A few things to note:

- Attendance is compulsory, as usual, for everything during Phases 1 and 2, up until May half term
- Attendance is obviously compulsory to the exams and exam Masterclasses after half term, in Phase 3
- However, during Phase 3 (after May half term), should you give permission for your child to be able to leave site to revise from home, please ensure the **reply slip below is signed** and returned to their form tutor ASAP, and no later than Thursday 7th April 2022
- If your child is going to stay at school for Phase 3, there will be study spaces provided.

Celebrating their time at NT:

After all their hard work, the class of 2022 certainly deserve to celebrate! There will be a Leavers' Day here at school after their last exam on Thursday 23rd June, with details to follow, and their Leavers' Ball is on Thursday 30th June. KS4 results day is Thursday 25th August, from 9.00am.

We are so looking forward to celebrating the end of KS4 with your child. They have been a pleasure to work with and we know they will continue to make us all proud in this last, final hurdle.

And to you, Year 11 – best of luck! You deserve every success.
