School Immunisation Programme

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Dear Parent/Guardian

YOUR CHILD'S HPV VACCINATION IS NOW DUE

Girls and boys aged 12-14 in school years 8 and 9 are offered the HPV (Human Papilloma Virus) vaccination as part of the NHS childhood immunisation programme. The vaccine protects against HPV related cancers such as cervical cancer in women, penile cancer in men and throat and neck cancers in both men and women; it is offered at schools in England as a course of 2 injections.

According to Cancer Research UK, cervical cancer is the second most common cancer in women under the age of 35. In the UK, 2900 women a year are diagnosed with cervical cancer - that is around eight women each day. It is estimated that about 400 lives could be saved every year in the UK as a result of vaccinating girls before they are infected with HPV. The number of diagnoses of genital warts in England has also fallen sharply in both girls and boys since the vaccination programme started, suggesting that boys had started to already benefit indirectly from the girls' programme through 'herd immunity' protection. Extension of the HPV programme to boys will save even more lives.

You will need to enter the unique code for your child's school. The code is **EE136533**Please submit your form by **midday on Friday 21**st **April 2023** to ensure your child receives their vaccination. Please also note that as in previous years you must **opt-in** to the programme. If a consent form is not submitted your child might <u>not</u> be vaccinated. If you decide not to have your child vaccinated, please let us know so we can enter this on your child's medical records.



- If you previously submitted a form giving consent for your child to be immunised you do not need to re-submit. This is because you have consented to the full treatment, i.e. 2 doses of the vaccine. If you are unsure, please call the team on **01872 221105** and they will be able to advise.
- Please note: Your child can self-consent to treatment if they are considered competent to do so by one of our nurses; this is known as Gillick competency.
