Celebrating the landscape and this rich influence on Cornwall's art heritage.</p> <p>Artists you may look at: Manet, Monet, Renoir, Cassatt, Morisot, Van Gogh, Terry Frost, Bryan Wynter, Patrick Heron, Wilhelmina Barns-Graham.</p> <p>You will focus on the Formal elements: Colour, shape, pattern, tone, texture and line. You will use a range of mark making techniques and tools to experiment with the application of a variety of materials.</p>
