


Make-up

GCSE years are an exciting and sometimes challenging step for every Tretherras student, and how they feel supported and valued is key to them thriving in the classrooms, in front of our expert teachers, and in all aspects of their life. We have a high quality pastoral team to ensure that all students feel this way. This starts with their form tutor each morning, building relationships and seeing that they are prepared to succeed each and every day. Your child's form tutor is your first point of contact and is important that both students and parent speak to these members of staff first about any concerns they might have.

Each year group also has a pastoral leader, for year 10 it's Miss Rickford, who is exceptionally trained in pastoral care and is also a non-teaching member of staff, who is readily available to support students and their families as much as possible with all pastoral needs.

CELT Support Plans

At Newquay Tretherras, we know how important it is to know our students and to meet their needs. Keyworkers from our SEND Team will be working with your child, and with you, to create a detailed profile highlighting any challenges your child may find with their learning. We have met with our primary school colleagues who have shared transition information, this will be an opportunity to review and add to this. We will then communicate your child's learning profile through individual CELT support plans and share these through staff clinics and staff training to ensure that their needs are met in their lessons.

Talking to you

We know that you will be keen to talk to the SEND Team within the first few weeks of your child's time at Tretherras. During the week beginning the 16th September we are making time to allow for this. We will send you information about how you can book this time. In addition, we would like to welcome you to a Family Café on Thursday 26th September, from 2pm in The Porth, at Tretherras. You will be able to meet other parents, carers and the NT SEND Team. We have also invited Katie Frampton, from the County Autism Advisory Team to join us.

Reading Screening

At Newquay Tretherras, we recognise how reading is of paramount importance, enabling success in all aspects of education and life beyond school. To help support our programme of reading interventions and to enable our teachers to target reading support, we will be conducting screening tests of all our students early in the academic year. These tests will allow us to produce an accurate reading age for your child. We will then identify if they need any additional support, to guarantee that every child leaves our school reading fluently and with accuracy. Following the screening process, we will contact you to share the results and discuss any possible reading intervention that we recommend for your child.

Use of coloured paper:

In line with current research, and many other schools across the country, we are using buff coloured paper only. Buff paper is highly likely to have the same supportive effect as any other colour your child may have accessed at their primary school. Students will be able to continue to use their individual-coloured overlays. We can supply these for your child and will be encouraging our students to be independent with this for their learning and any assessments they undertake.

Attendance

Here at Newquay Tretherras, we recognise the importance of regular and punctual school attendance. We routinely monitor attendance to ensure that all students understand the importance of attendance and feel supported to develop excellent attendance habits. We also love to celebrate excellent attendance through weekly housepoints, attendance awards and during celebration assemblies just to name a few.

We do, however, understand that at times, unwell and students are absence unavoidable. In this case, we ask that parents/carers contact the school with a reason for absence. In addition, we know that at times, some students struggle to attend school. At Newquay Tretherras, we pride ourselves on our pastoral care and we will do all we can to remove any barriers that students may have which stops attending daily whilst ensuring they feel fully supported. To further encourage and support positive attendance, we conduct home visits to households where a student is absent for a period of time and we have received no contact from parents/carers to confirm a reason for their absence.

A recent study has shown that if a child is absent for one of the first days of the new term, for unauthorised reasons, they are much more likely to miss long periods of their schooling compared to their peers who attended those first days. These children had a predicted overall absence of almost 45%. This shows just how important it is that children are at school, ready to learn, in the first days of the September term.



Students who attend school at least 96% of time achieve a grade higher (on average) in every subject they study for GCSE, compared to students with attendance below 90%

August will see the changes to the National Penalty Notice Framework come into force. Specifically, the changes are:

- 1. A new national threshold of 10 unauthorised sessions for any reason (equivalent to 5 school days) within a rolling 10 school week period for which a penalty notice must be considered. A penalty fine can be issued for any combination of unauthorised absences over a 10- week rolling period. They can be consecutive or non-consecutive and can span over two terms.
- 2. An increase in the penalty fine from £60 to £80 if paid in 21 days. If the fine is not paid by the first 21 days, it will rise to £160 if paid within 28 days of being issued.
- 3. If a 2nd penalty fine is issued to the same parent for the same child within a 3-year rolling period, the fine will automatically rise to £160 with no option to pay the lower rate of £80.
- 4. If a parent then commits a third offence in a 3-year rolling period, the local authority will need to consider options available to them to improve attendance. This will include a consideration to prosecute under section 444 of the Education Act 1996.
- 5. The current penalty notice warning letter used for unauthorised absence (not holiday) will be changed to a Notice to Improve.

Policy Updates

- Travel Arrangements Make sure you know how to get to school on time and how to get home.

Another brilliant year of results!

Newquay Tretherras is celebrating a set of GCSE results to be proud of with results above national averages at every measure. The class of 2024 were full of smiles and tears of joy as they opened their envelopes, supported by teachers who couldn't be prouder of their achievements.

Our core subjects: English, Maths and Combined Science, all scored over 70% Grade 4+, which is at least 10% higher than national averages. The extraordinary results in these core subjects equips our students with the currency they need to move on to the next phase of their education and have every door still open to them.


We also had phenomenal success in our creative subjects with an incredible improvement in our Music department with 93% of students achieving Grade 4+ (17% higher than national averages) and Art, Photography and Drama also being at least 10% higher than national averages at Grade 4+.
