# **Dress Code**

Sixth Formers in a school which is 11 -18 are in an unusual position. They have privileges and freedoms that are not granted to those in Year 7 – 11. It is important that sixth form students are sensitive to our school community and set a good example to our younger students.

Students need to be suitably dressed for study. Smart clothing comes in many forms, and in cases of uncertainty, 6th team have the final say but a common-sense choice of jeans, trousers, t-shirts, shirts, shorts, trainers or shoes will be acceptable.

Please, **DO NOT** wear the following:

Crop tops and thin strapped tops.

Shorts and skirts should be no shorter than relaxed arm's length at the side of the body. Clothing with inappropriate slogans.

No hoods up.

Shoes with very high heels.

Students who are not considered to be dressed according to this policy may be asked to go home and change, particularly if a verbal warning has previously been given by the Sixth Form Team

# **Attendance**

Here at Newquay Tretherras, we recognise the importance of regular and punctual school attendance. We routinely monitor attendance to ensure that all students understand the importance of attendance and feel supported to develop excellent attendance habits. We also love to celebrate excellent attendance through weekly housepoints, attendance awards and during celebration assemblies just to name a few.

We do, however, understand that at times, students are unwell and absence is unavoidable. In this case, we ask that parents/carers contact the school with a reason for absence. In addition, we know that at times, some students struggle to attend school. At Newquay Tretherras, we pride ourselves on our pastoral care and we will do all we can to remove any barriers that students may have which stops them attending daily whilst ensuring they feel fully supported. To further encourage and support positive attendance, we conduct home visits to households where a student is absent for a period of time and we have received no contact from parents/carers to confirm a reason for their absence.

A recent study has shown that if a child is absent for one of the first days of the new term, for unauthorised reasons, they are much more likely to miss long periods of their schooling compared to their peers who attended those first days. These children had a predicted overall absence of almost 45%. This shows just how important it is that children are at school, ready to learn, in the first days of the September term.



Students who attend school at least 96% of time achieve a grade higher (on average) in every subject they study, compared to students with attendance below 90%

Students are required in 6th form from 8:30 - 13:15.

They can then sign out if they don't have a lesson period 4.

# **Another brilliant** year of results!

Newquay Tretherras is celebrating a set of GCSE results to be proud of with results above national averages at every measure. The class of 2024 were full of smiles and tears of joy as they opened their envelopes, supported by teachers who couldn't be prouder of their achievements.

Our core subjects: English, Maths and Combined Science, all scored over 70% Grade 4+, which is at least 10% higher than national averages. The extraordinary results in these core subjects equips our students with the currency they need to move on to the next phase of their education and have every door still open to them.

We also had phenomenal success in our creative subjects with an incredible improvement in our Music department with 93% of students achieving Grade 4+ (17% higher than national averages) and Art, Photography and Drama also being at least 10% higher than national averages at Grade 4+.

### **CONTINUED GREAT NEWS FROM NT6!**

Newquay Tretherras' Sixth Form continues its strong tradition of achieving the highest possible KS5 Vocational grades, with students successfully gaining places on their desired degree courses and apprenticeships.

Tretherras students achieved top A-level grades include: Nell G who has gained a place at the University of Oxford to study Chinese, Bluebell F who will be studying Chemistry at Bath University, Harry S who has accepted a place at Bristol University to study Biological Sciences, Jasmine G who will be studying History at Exeter, Rhys B who has secured a place at Falmouth University to study Computer Science, Cameron J who will be studying Economics and Econometrics at Bristol University and Ella S who will be studying Physics at Exeter University.
