THE NT CURRICULUM

It's Their Story to Tell



At Newquay Tretherras we want all of our young people to achieve highly, communicate convincingly, decide wisely and engage fully. Our NT Curriculum gives all students the opportunity and motivation to do this. We have one exciting and inspiring curriculum made up of four parts: our academic curricular; our pastoral and character curricular; our extra curricular, and our careers and ambitions curricular.

At NT we value all of our subjects. We offer a broad and rich curriculum that both challenges and inspires students to be curious and confident as they question the world around them to make society well. Our KS3 learners enjoy a full suite of creative arts, taught by specialists, and have discrete lessons in Art, Music, Drama and DT. Students can choose between two languages, French or Spanish, and also relish the discussions and issues raised in PSHE and Religious and Ethics lessons. Learning from Year 7 will be engaging and challenging as our youngest family members begin subjects and acquire knowledge they may not have experienced before. The KS3 Curriculum is designed with progression at its centre, aiming to ensure that learning from KS2 is sequenced effectively and appropriately for our students. English and Maths schemes of learning have been written collaboratively with KS2 subject specialists in these areas so that students feel secure, motivated and challenged to

achieve their very best from day one There is support in place for learners at all stages and we take the time to ensure all students can access their curriculum, whatever their starting point. At Key Stage 4 the offer broadens further still with 28 qualifications to choose from! Students can explore disciplines they have not yet experienced, such as Media Studies, Sociology, Enterprise and Marketing. Students in Year 9 are guided by specialists, in one to one interviews, to ensure they are well informed and to celebrate their decisions as they move into their examination years. Key Stage 4 sees the beginning of their GCSE and Vocational courses. Students will already be able to see their KS3 learning impacting on knowledge they are now accessing at KS4, and teachers will support students in this by making links both across and within the curriculum.

A rigorous revision programme, SORT, runs across all subjects and helps students to Summarise, Organise, Recall and Test their knowledge throughout the year so they are best placed to succeed in their examinations at the end of Year 11. Ultimately, our curriculum is ambitious, rich, judicious, purposefully designed for our young people of Newquay, and is well sequenced, preparing Newquay Tretherras students to remember, understand and apply knowledge that they will need to live a full and happy life.

JOINING THE NT FAMILY

The Transition to Years 7, 8 & 9









Prior to students beginning at Tretherras we work in close partnership with our local primary schools to establish good relationships with younger students, and to provide opportunities that ensure their transition to secondary school is as smooth as possible and a pleasurable experience.

We run a series of Youth University programmes in the Autumn term for Year 5 and 6 students to help them get a feel for what we do at Tretherras. Each Youth University session is themed around our curriculum, including Sport, Creative Arts and STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Maths).

We also offer a 'See Our School In Session' morning in the summer term when you are welcome to come along and see our school in action as it is on a normal school day.

In addition, we provide the opportunity for pupils and parents to come and talk to teaching staff from each subject during

our Open Evening and Open Morning that takes place each September.

We are extremely proud of our pastoral system at Tretherras, and we know that it is important that students feel supported the moment they start here in Year 7.

When starting in Year 7, students are allocated a form tutor, who they register with every day during their time at Tretherras. Their form tutor will be responsible for supporting them throughout their journey here, whether that be academically, or just to be a listening ear! The role of the Head of Year is to oversee the transition process, to support the whole year group, and also to be a point of contact for parents.

We endeavour to ensure that your child always feels safe at Tretherras, and firmly believe that supporting their mental health and wellbeing will enable them to flourish in their studies.

JOINING KEY STAGE 3 - NT ETHOS AND CULTURE

Respect at the heart of all we do

At Tretherras we believe that everyone deserves to feel safe and valued. We encourage good manners and respect for others.

We have a shared responsibility to ensure that everyone has the right to learn and teach in an environment, which is free from disruption and from behaviour that prevents others from learning.

We expect our students to behave as good citizens in school, in the local community and as members of the Sixth Form. Their appearance and behaviour should reflect a positive image at all times, including their arrival and departure to and from school.

Attendance

To engage fully with their education students need to be in school every day. We have a minimum attendance expectation of 96%, but of course, strive for and celebrate 100% attendance (where medical exemptions are not a factor).

Punctuality

All students need to arrive at school, before 8.25am, at which time the gates will be locked.

KEY STAGE 4

Years 10 & 11









In Year 9 students will continue to follow a broad and balanced curriculum and continue to study the Modern Foreign Language they have studied in Years 7 and 8. Students in Year 9 will continue to be taught all the Creative and Performing Art subjects by specialist teachers as discrete subjects.

Part-way through Year 9 students complete their option process for their Level 2 programe of study in Years 10 and 11, choosing 4 options to complement their core curriculum. In Years 10 and 11, all students follow a core curriculum which includes English Language and English Literature, Mathematics and Science. In addition, all students follow a course in Physical Education, Religion Ethics and Philosophy and PSHE. They will also receive Careers Guidance, Health and Well-being and Citizenship through their form programe which may include some drop down study days. All students in Year 10 undertake a week's Work Experience in the summer term. We believe that the best courses and subjects for students are the ones that suit them best, which they enjoy the most, and which offer them clear progression to study and training beyond Year 11. This is why we offer a wide range of subjects to give our students the greatest choice possible.

KEY STAGE 5

Years 12 & 13



I am pleased to announce that with Bodmin now joining CELT we are launching an exciting new Post 16 provision, CELTSixth from September 2024. This is going to provide a much wider range of choice for all CELT students including students at NT.

A high percentage of our Year 11 students choose to continue their education at NT, which supports and challenges students to achieve their highest academic potential. We are especially proud of our results, with over 69% of students achieving A*/B at A Level last year. The Sixth Form regularly provides candidates for Oxbridge, Medicine and Russell Group Universities. The majority of our students chose to go on to University or take up higher/degree level apprenticeships on leaving us.

Our latest Ofsted report states that in our Sixth Form, 'Teachers ensure that students understand assessment objectives and know what they need to do to improve their understanding. They particularly value the individual support they receive from

teachers and the pastoral care available'. CELTSixth Curriculum consists of 31 courses offering Level 3 qualifications in AS, A Level and Vocational, as well as re-sits for English

and Mathematics GCSEs if required. Coming for 2025, we are also looking to launch a selected range of T Levels.

With a direct transportation link between NT and Bodmin Campus, students will also have access to a wide range of vocational course at both Level 2 and 3 including Construction, Hairdressing, Barbering, Beauty, Childcare and a range of creative qualifications. From 2025 we will also be launching a full suite of T Levels including Business & Administration, Digital Media Broadcasting & Production, Digital Support Services and Craft & Design. Our students have high ambitions to further their academic studies, and can expect to receive outstanding care, guidance and individual support to be successful. Students regularly review their progress and are closely supported to ensure that they achieve the grades required to enable them to follow their chosen career path.

CELTSixth is a vibrant, warm and friendly place which provides the opportunity for students to develop their leadership and personal skills alongside academic study. Sixth Formers are role models for our younger students and are integral to the success of our school.

Personal Development

At Newquay Tretherras, we are committed to giving our students opportunities to develop and extend their personal qualities, social skills and character.

We aim to do this through the following programmes:

NT HOUSE SYSTEM:

Provides a friendly environment for healthy competition through regular events, such as NT's Got Talent, Sports Day – resulting in one House being awarded the House Cup

NT CHARACTER:

In Years 7 to 9, the Character programme seeks to provide activities and challenges to develop our seven core NT Character traits.

NT TUTORIAL PROGRAMME:

During tutor time, there is a planned READ and WORD programme that develops all students' literacy skills, as well as encouraging a love of reading.

NT PSHE:

Students in Years 7 to 11 have fortnightly PSHE lessons that cover a programme of relationships and sex education lessons, drugs and alcohol education, mental health, and other important personal issues.

SPECIAL EVENTS:

The school celebrates important national and international events which form the basis of a week of events across tutorial time, lessons, and during lunch and breaks, such as Anti-Bullying Week.

ACTIVITY WEEK:

Towards the end of the summer term, the school holds a week of special activities for students across Years 7 to 9 that replaces the normal timetable of lessons.

We are committed to the highest standards in Spiritual, Moral, Social and Cultural education for all our students. Our delivery of PSHE is part of something that we are proud to call "The Tretherras Way". It is the total combination rich and rewarding academic curriculum (including specialist PSHE lessons), dedicated pastoral care and support, a friendly but competitive house system, and a comprehensive programme of special events, extra-curricular clubs and activities such as Year 7 Camp. We provide students with additional support through our Wellbeing Mentors. The personal qualities and character development of our students are celebrated each year during our annual awards events, with students having the opportunity to be awarded the Tretherras Way Award which is amongst the most prized accolades in the school.

THE LEARNING CENTRE

Personalised Learning and Well-being Hub



Our mission is to know, value and understand all our students, ensuring they have equal access to a flexible, creative curriculum and foster inclusion for all.

The Learning Centre is central within our school. The core purpose is education and enabling some of our more vulnerable students to succeed. It gives support for students who are experiencing emotional or physical difficulties that can create barriers to learning.

There are two parts to 'The Learning Centre' which work collaboratively together to get a good balance for students. 'The Learning Centre' classroom is where students will access timetabled lessons and have an opportunity to work with personalised learning mentors so they can continue to access their school timetable and subjects.

How to access The Learning Centre:

Students can ask for support through their Director of Key Stage. Referrals will be made, and we will liaise with students and/or parents so that we can get the best possible provision for students needing extra support.

SAFEGUARDING

NT HOUSE SYSTEM













Every student and staff member at Newquay Tretherras is assigned a House from either Godrevy, Longships, Pendeen, Wolf Rock or Lizard. All NT Houses are named after Lighthouses from the South West Coast, as a means of reminding students of our shared Cornish heritage. Our choice of House identities are designed to emphasise the importance of positive guidance – as lighthouses literally provide help and guidance to those who might be lost without it.

The House system creates friendly and healthy competition, promotes good work and behaviour, aspirations, raises encourages teamwork, develops a positive sense of community, provides opportunities to take on responsibilities (such as House Sports Captain) and creates a welcoming environment, allowing social integration across different year groups within a stable and secure structure. As well as creating a sense of belonging, there are opportunities for leadership and mentoring through interaction between year groups. House teams also work closely with the local community to promote fundamental British Values. Houses have helped to raise money for lots of charities including the RNLI, Cancer Research, Marie Curie, the Terrence Higgins Trust, and most recently the Cornwall Air Ambulance. Each young person is placed in a House of around 300 students of all ages. There is a House Assembly once every half term. The Head of House updates students on the success and achievements of House members, and provides rewards to acknowledge participation in House events and competitions. Through the house system, students can encourage and support their peers in the Performing Arts, Sporting, Social



and Academic competitions. There are lots of competitions throughout the year - NT's Got Talent, The Great Tretherras Bake Off, Language Week, Inter-house Sports, and NT Chess. Year 7 and 8 students have their own House Competitions that are linked to their specific NT Character challenges – such as the Empathy Shoebox Challenge where each House tries to create the best box of items that will be provided as Christmas gifts for some of Newquay's elderly residents, to show the older generation they are valued by the newest generation of NT students. House charity week is a week when students can help contribute to the local community by raising money for charity. Charity Week is led by the NT Heads of House. For example, we previously raised over £1,200 for Cornwall Air Ambulance.

Sports Day in the summer term is a wonderful event with the expectation that all students participate and champion their house, whether through taking part or simply by supporting those involved in competition.



CELEBRATING SUCCESS











At Newquay Tretherras we strongly believe in celebrating the hard work and achievements of every student. This culture of rewarding students, who are being remarkable and performing at their best, permeates throughout the school.

Success can come in many forms and we celebrate it in many ways. Recognition of our students' academic success is celebrated with presentation of certificates evenings with prizes awarded to the highest performing students at GCSE, A-Level and in Vocational courses.

Each Key Stage of the school has its own

Awards Evening, recognising the highest performing students and those making the most progress in the academic year, as well as those who have made outstanding contributions to the school and wider community. Sporting and Artistic success is also highly valued at Tretherras, with separate awards events recognising the achievements of students in these fields.

Our belief in rewarding hard work and success is central to inspiring young people, and means that even the smaller day-to-day achievements do not go unnoticed through the school's rewards systems and house points.

NT SPORT















An engaging and varied sporting programme achieving academic success and physical wellbeing

We have a range of excellent facilities on site for our sports programmes which we are continuously looking to develop. These include a 3G Astro, Dance Studio, Gym, Sports Hall and extensive hardcourt areas and playing fields. Our partnership with the Newquay Sports and Community Centre gives us full use of the entire complex throughout the school week to extend the range of activities and events we offer, adding an indoor climbing wall, and indoor cricket nets to the facilities available to our students.

The NT Sport and Dance team is made up of 11 experienced and committed staff who are supported by a number of other individuals from within and outside of the school. Many are experts in their chosen sports, coaching at County and Regional levels.

Many pupils have excelled and have represented the County, South West England and their Country in sports including Rugby, Soccer, Netball, Cricket, Hockey, Cross Country, Athletics, Surfing, Tennis, Trampolining, Dance and Golf. We have a hugely successful and accredited Sports Leadership Programme,

supporting various Primary activities and National events throughout the year. We are regular hosts to County, Regional and National competitions.

Physical Education is taught to all students in Years 7 to 11 with a focus on the development of students' knowledge and understanding of various sports & activities and giving them the confidence to engage and participate in sport for life. Students experience a variety of activities in all Key Stages which aim to develop their knowledge, skills and understanding and promote a healthy active lifestyle. Regular inter-house and inter-school competitions also take place with students representing their house groups in a variety of activities.

Students have the opportunity to study GCSE PE, Level 2 Cambridge National in Sport Science, A-Level PE and the Level 3 Cambridge Technical in Sport as they progress through the school, with many achieving notable success and results amongst the best in the country.

NT OUTDOOR LEARNING







At Tretherras we have a department dedicated to the provision of Outdoor and Adventurous learning, providing an exceptional opportunity for students to develop themselves. It encourages meaningful experiences in an exciting and adventurous way within a comprehensive and robust framework of safety.

These adventures are not only memorable but life changing, whether students are canoeing down a local river, rock climbing on a sea cliff, navigating their way through the mountains in the Lake District or sleeping in a snow-hole in the Scottish Highlands. Involvement in these challenges enriches students' day-to-day learning, builds their confidence, provides the environment to work on growth mindset and develop leadership skills, all key attributes both in the classroom, as well as day-to-day life. The values your child will gain from these unique experiences will set them apart from others and show their true character to prospective employers and in future further education.

Safety is a key priority that underpins all aspects of our provision. We have been complimented by outside agencies and seek external ratification on our procedures. We are directly licenced by the Duke of Edinburgh's Award to deliver Bronze, Silver and Gold Doff Awards.

Bronze DofE is delivered in Year 9. Students can then take part in Silver DofE in Year 10 with Gold DofE taking place in the Sixth Form. Students don't need to have done any level before.

We have a progressive Outdoor Learning strategy that includes a focus on empowerment through frontier adventure alongside raising awareness of the natural world and society.

Outdoor Learning forms part of both our curricular and extra-curricular offer at Tretherras. In Years 7 to 10 students are selected by Pastoral Leads to take part in our various programmes. These range from a single day activity, through to week-long programmes or an adventurous residential. Students can then choose to participate in our extra-curricular offer, whether that's a weekly climbing club or spending a week in the Lake District on a mountain skills residential.

Once in the Sixth Form, students can do their Gold DofE, take part in a winter mountaineering trip to the Scottish Highlands and become an Outdoor Leader, learning key leadership skills and inspiring and supporting the younger year groups to be successful in the programmes they are participating in.

NT CREATIVE

Creativity at our Core









Newquay Tretherras has an extensive Expressive Arts programme based around the subjects of Art, Photography, Music, Dance and Drama. We encourage creativity, collaboration and enquiry in all aspects of the curriculum, both in lesson time and in learning that takes place outside of the classroom.

Throughout the three year Key Stage 3 students receive one year of an Arts subject every week and two years of an Arts subject once every two weeks. This consists of Art, Drama and Music. Many of our students go on to study creative subjects at GCSE, A Level and Further Education.

There are lots of exciting opportunities for students to develop creativity, work with others and to nurture individual talents. Newquay Tretherras has a reputation for providing high quality arts experiences both within the curriculum, including at examination levels, and as part of our extensive extra-curricular Expressive and Performing Arts activities.

We offer an exciting programme of productions, with the annual Christmas and Spring Concert providing students with a platform to show their talents as musicians and singers, whilst the summer Dance Show features dance in a wide variety of styles from ballet to hip-hop. The annual Art Exhibition highlights the skills of our photographers and visual artists across painting, printing and sculpture. Whole school creativity is emphasised in the Bi-Annual Drama production which sees collaboration across all of the creative subjects.

Additionally, we offer our students regular opportunities to visit dance and drama productions and watch them digitally. Your child will be able to work alongside professional artists and dance will regularly contribute their talents to community events. We have close links and working partnerships with KEAP, the Tate Gallery, Falmouth University, Cornwall Music Hub to name but a few. Whether it is visiting a musical or dance show, performing a full musical, exhibiting their art or photographs or learning to play a new instrument, there are a wealth of opportunities on offer.

NT EXTRA CURRICULAR

Beyond the classroom - After School Clubs









We enrich our curriculum through an extensive and unique 'Out of Hours' Learning Programme, which embraces volunteering, an adventurous Outdoor Education programme, a wide range of Sports and Arts, and high quality opportunities in Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics.

Many staff from a diverse range of curriculum areas give up their time at the end of the school day to provide opportunities for all students to pursue their interests and develop their skills and talents. Extra-curricular opportunities strengthen students' enjoyment of school life and creates opportunities for learning beyond the classroom.

At Newquay Tretherras we also provide a wide range of residential and non-residential trips which promote and engage students in the wider world in which we all live.

A few examples of the trips we have offered are: The Big Bang Science Fair in Birmingham, visit to CERN, Iceland Geography field trip, Major Sporting Events, Theatre Royal Plymouth, Royal Albert Hall, Outdoor Education visits to Cairngorms Scotland, The Lake District, The Wye Valley, Dartmoor, Eden Project, Paris with Maths, Berlin with History, Austria for Skiing and Snowboarding, South of France for Watersports and a Camp Internationals trip to Ecuador.

How priority for a place at Newquay Tretherras is determined:

Newquay Tretherras has long prided itself on its family ethos, with generations of students from across the Newquay area passing through our doors.
