## Transfer Day Wednesday 2nd July 2025

As well as meeting your child's tutor after school, there is also an exciting opportunity for you to try out our new music department.




### The First Day Back - 4th September

Our Year 11 Prefect Team will be assigned to Year 7 classes for the first fortnight to help students find their rooms, as we are a big site!






The 2 key areas of school are:



# Mr Andy Booth Director of Key Stage 3

Our high quality pastoral care at NT is something we are very proud of, and we want students to feel supported in all areas of their life. In order to thrive in the classroom, students need a combination of high quality teaching and to feel valued. By developing a good understanding of the lives of our students, we strive to ensure this value is felt by everyone at Tretherras.

Every morning, students will meet with their form tutor, and these will become the members of staff who get to know students the most. Their role is to prepare students for the day ahead, and to support them in achieving their full potential. They will check uniform and equipment to ensure everyone is 'NT Ready' encourage literacy through our reading programme, as well as being a listening ear and first point of parental/carer contact. It is therefore important that both students and parents speak to these members of staff first about any concerns that they might have.

Each year group also has a Pastoral Leader, who is exceptionally trained in pastoral care and as a non-teaching member of staff is readily available to support students and their families as much as possible with all pastoral needs.

Sometimes some students find it incredibly difficult to take the first step to raise a concern or ask a question face to face about bullying or social concerns, therefore we encourage parents and students to use our 'talk to us' feature on the school website, as we can then log and track any concerns <u>Talk To Us - (tretherras.net)</u> and act quickly to resolve the issues.

The first year of a big secondary school can feel a bit daunting, and we want to support our students to feel safe and supported. As the director of Key Stage 3, I would love to hear your feedback, questions or concerns about our new students to ensure everyone is happy and thriving at NT!

We are a cash free school so all trips, visits and canteen purchases can be made via the Parent Pay website. In September details of how to set up your parent account will be share at Expectations Evenings.




### **NT Newsletter**

#### **CELT Support Plans**

At Newquay Tretherras, we know how important it is to know our students and to meet their needs. Keyworkers from our SEND Team will be working with your child, and with you, to create a detailed profile highlighting any challenges your child may find with their learning. We have met with our primary school colleagues who have shared transition information, this will be an opportunity to review and add to this. We will then communicate your child's learning profile through individual CELT support plans and share these through staff clinics and staff training to ensure that their needs are met in their lessons.

#### Talking to you

We know that you will be keen to talk to the SEND Team within the first few weeks of your child's time at Tretherras. During the first half term, we are making time to allow for this. We will send you information about how you can book this time

#### **Reading Screening**

At Newquay Tretherras, we recognise how reading is of paramount importance, enabling success in all aspects of education and life beyond school. To help support our programme of reading interventions and to enable our teachers to target reading support, we will be conducting screening tests of all our students early in the academic year. These tests will allow us to produce an accurate reading age for your child. We will then identify if they need any additional support, to guarantee that every child leaves our school reading fluently and with accuracy. Following the screening process, we will contact you to share the results and discuss any possible reading intervention that we recommend for your child.
