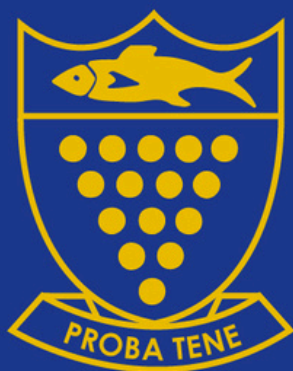

Attendance

Here at Newquay Tretherras, we recognise the importance of regular and punctual school attendance. We routinely monitor attendance to ensure that all students understand the importance of attendance and feel supported to develop excellent attendance habits. We also love to celebrate excellent attendance through weekly housepoints, attendance awards and during celebration assemblies just to name a few.

We do, however, understand that at times, students are unwell and absence is unavoidable. In this case, we ask that parents/carers contact the school with a reason for absence. In addition, we know that at times, some students struggle to attend school. At Newquay Tretherras, we pride ourselves on our pastoral care and we will do all we can to remove any barriers that students may have which stops them attending daily whilst ensuring they feel fully supported. To further encourage and support positive attendance, we conduct home visits to households where a student is absent for a period of time and we have received no contact from parents/carers to confirm a reason for their absence.

A recent study has shown that if a child is absent for one of the first days of the new term, for unauthorised reasons, they are much more likely to miss long periods of their schooling compared to their peers who attended those first days. These children had a predicted overall absence of almost 45%. This shows just how important it is that children are at school, ready to learn, in the first days of the September term.



Students who attend school at least 96% of time achieve a grade higher (on average) in every subject they study for GCSE, compared to students with attendance below 90%

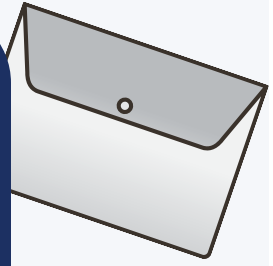


School Bag - All students must bring a school bag.

A Learning Pack which includes:

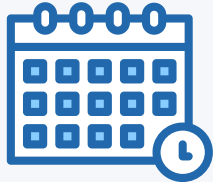

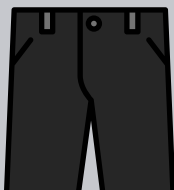

Year 10 students undertake a week of work experience at the end of July to help them develop valuable life skills and gain a deeper understanding of the world of work. This opportunity allows them to explore potential career paths, build confidence in real-world settings, and apply the skills they've learned in school to practical situations.

As some work experience placements are highly sought after (and we are often competing with other schools) we encourage students to begin searching for a placement in September. While students are expected to take the initiative in securing their own placements, support and guidance are readily available where needed. Once a placement is secured, the relevant paperwork must be completed by both parents or carers, and the employer, in order for the placement to be approved and safety checks carried out.

During their placement, students will be provided with a logbook to complete, allowing them to record their activities and reflect meaningfully on their experience. By engaging with local employers and experiencing the day-to-day demands of a working environment, students can make more informed choices about their future education and employment. The experience also fosters independence, responsibility, and communication skills—all of which are essential for their personal and professional growth.





NT Outdoor Learning

NT Outdoor Learning aims to provide meaningful outdoor adventures that both challenge and inspire. We empower students to navigate risk responsibly, make confident choices, and cultivate a lifelong passion for the outdoors.

NT Cultural Empowerment

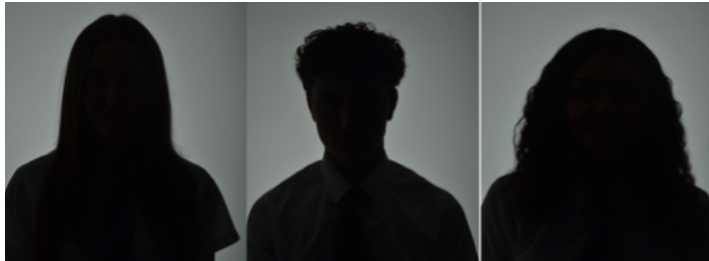
Our Cultural Empowerment Group is a safe, supportive space where students from racially and culturally minoritised backgrounds can come together to share experiences, celebrate identity, and drive positive change across our school.

The group meets weekly and is student-led, with sessions designed to build confidence, solidarity and leadership. Activities range from creative expression (like poetry, art and storytelling) to discussions about lived experience, representation, and equity in school life. Students also develop mini-campaigns, displays, and initiatives that help educate and inspire the wider school community.

Our aims for the year ahead include:

- Creating visibility through student-led displays and awareness events
- Building trust between students, staff, and families

CELT Success Plans

At Newquay Tretherras, we know how important it is to know our students and to meet their needs. Keyworkers from our SEND Team will be working with your child, and with you, to create a detailed profile highlighting any challenges your child may find with their learning. We have met with our primary school colleagues who have shared transition information, this will be an opportunity to review and add to this. We will then communicate your child's learning profile through individual CELT Success Plans and share these through staff clinics and staff training to ensure that their needs are met in their lessons.

Talking to you

We know that you will be keen to talk to the SEND Team within the first few weeks of your child's time at Tretherras. During the first half term, we are making time to allow for this. We will send you information about how you can book this time.

Reading Screening

At Newquay Tretherras, we recognise how reading is of paramount importance, enabling success in all aspects of education and life beyond school. To help support our programme of reading interventions and to enable our teachers to target reading support, we will be conducting screening tests of all our students early in the academic year. These tests will allow us to produce an accurate reading age for your child. We will then identify if they need any additional support, to guarantee that every child leaves our school reading fluently and with accuracy. Following the screening process, we will contact you to share the results and discuss any possible reading intervention that we recommend for your child.
